Entered service November 3, 1942 at Milwaukee.

Discharged May 2, 1943. Canable, FL.

Was rushed to Marine Hospital for a partial paralysis caused by a nervous condition.

Born in one of the yellow brick houses on Lakeview. Later in life lived on his boat.

He built the boat, named 'Namaycush'. It was 52 feet long and all steel. He hired it out for fishermen (\$65 a day, or \$10 an hour) He was a fishing guide on the Island, and being very talented, built several boats for rent where Cap's Marina is now located. He also ferried people across the Door in his boat.

His parents were Berndt Anderson and Dorothea Lucke.

Married late in life. Never wore socks, but wore one on day he got married. Married Amelia Amy Jacobsen on November 1, 1930, and then Emily Gebhart on Feb 25, 1944, who ran a restaurant near the ferry dock. On January 3, 1968 he married Mildred C. Miller. Cap's Marina was started by him.
