He was in the Army in Co A 110 MG BN, also Machine Gun Co 340th Inf, 85th Div from 4/28/1918 to 10/10/1918, then to Co A 10th Machine gun Btn to August 1919.

He is registered in the Wisconsin Military Museum in Madison.

Served in France during World War I during the battles of the Meuse, Argonne Offensive, and Metz, Germany.

Among his camps were Camp Custer, MI; Camp Mills, Long Island, NY; Winchester, England; Brest, France; Brest, France; Les Aix de Angillion, France; and Broll, Germany.

He was in the hospital in Hautheim, Germany from 2/1/1919 to 2/15/1919 for flu.

He sailed from NY on *Baltonia* and arrived Halifax, arriving 7/2/1918 Manchester, England, and went to Camp at LeHavre, France. Sailed from Brest, France 7/15/1919 on *SS Cleveland*, arriving NY 8/1/1919.

Earned the Victory medal

Parents were Stan Lunde and Andrea (?) RootsMagic.
